On the 14th April 2025 IOP held its customary annual general assembly where members and various invited guests convened to discuss and review key organizational matters. This year's

meeting was particularly significant as members reviewed and approved both the performance and financial reports of the IOP. Additionally, the meeting saw the approval of the IOP's five-year strategic plan for 2025 to 2029, which will guide the organization's activities and goals over the coming years.

Guests at the meeting contributed diverse perspectives, notably advising the government to continue its commitment to community education and to maintain close collaboration with non-governmental organizations (NGOs), recognizing their valuable role in supporting government objectives. They also emphasized the importance of reminding local citizens near infrastructure projects—especially those established by NGOs—about the need to maintain these projects and infrastructures to facilitate government efforts.

The general assembly serves not only as a constitutional requirement but also as a critical platform for IOP to engage with stakeholders such as government representatives and NGOs. It provides an opportunity to promote IOP's activities, foster dialogue, and strengthen partnerships. The meeting concluded with delegates and guests having time to network and build stronger relationships.

The event was a significant tribute to Berit, the founder of IOP, highlighting her extensive contributions to the Ilula community and the organization's growth.

The celebration provided an opportunity for attendees to learn about Berit's foundational role in establishing IOP and her impactful projects, such as sponsoring children's education and the establishment of the IOP Center. Many participants shared heartfelt testimonies about Berit's dedication and influence, expressed through speeches, songs, poetry, and drama. Documentaries showcasing IOP's projects and the success stories of previously sponsored students were also presented, enriching the evening's program.

The event was lively and festive, featuring music and dancing, but a standout moment was the presentation of special gifts to Berit aimed at supporting children at the IOP Orphans Home. Generous donations included clothing, food, sanitation materials, and cash contributions. Notably, IOP Netherlands donated 5,000 Euros,

volunteers contributed 885 Euros, Kragero Group gave 4 million Tanzanian shillings, Omatt Kragero Frivilligse donated 25,700,000 Tanzanian shillings, IOP staff donated items worth 200,000/= former and current IOP students donated 1,080,000/= and the former IOP Center girls donated items worth 85,000=/. During the celebration also there were people, companies and institutions that promised to continue supporting the Orphanage including FFF Tanzania
